Tier I Infractions (Teacher Responsibility)

Teacher Note: Questions or concerns, contact a Leadership Team member.

After Redirection*:

1. Refusal to follow directions
2. Talking during instruction
3. Talking at inappropriate times
4. Willful disruption of class (shouting, farting, loud noises, etc.)
5. Profanity among students
6. Leaving the classroom
7. Cheating on test (zero on test and contact parent)
8. Cell phones (phone is given to an administrator)
9. Eating/drinking in class
10. Obscene gestures
11. Loudness in the halls
12. Playing in the halls
13. Teasing
14. Uniform Violations: as required by District Policy

Proximity

Demonstrate/Review appropriate requirements

Tier II Infractions (Administration Responsibility)

1. Tardies; excessive early checkout
2. Gambling
3. Fighting
4. Assault on a fellow students
5. Threatening the teacher
6. Possession of pornography; explicit images
7. Assault on a school employee
8. Unauthorized computer use
9. Bullying – use specific action word
10. Vandalism
11. Sexual harassment
12. Attendance issues
13. Gang membership/secret clubs
14. Bomb threats
15. Contributing to chaotic situation
16. Disorderly conduct
17. Loitering of suspended students
18. Student walkouts
19. Possession of tobacco products
20. Stealing
21. Soliciting
22. Under the influence
23. Possessing weapons
24. Forgery/falsification
25. Possession of excessive money – administration calls parent
26. Public display of affection and/or sexual behavior
27. Verbal abuse of a teacher

Tier III Infractions (Counselor Responsibility)

1. Refusal to participate, complete assignments, or put forth effort
2. Withdrawn from students
3. Attendance issues
